| 3. Read Isaiah 7:14 and answer the following questions:   |
| Critics of the Bible often scoff at the idea that Jesus was born of a virgin. How could you prove to such a critic that Jesus' virgin birth is plausible?                         |
| What does "Immanuel" mean and what does it communicate about the Messiah's nature?  |
| 4. If you had been one of the Wisemen what gift would you have presented to King Jesus? Why would choose that gift? (You don't have to stick with gold, frankincense, and myrrh!) |
