## The Person & Work of the Holy Spirit

This week in our continuing study of the spiritual gifts we look at a couple of gifts that may surprise you—gifts that many do not realize are spiritual in nature but are in fact given by the Holy Spirit to bless the saints.

1) The gift of exhortation

"Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them... he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness."

Romans 12:6 § 8

- Think back to the example in Acts 9:26-28; what did the gift of exhortation move Barnabas to do that no one else in the church was willing to do? What does that reveal about the gift of exhortation?
